## **ALLISON INQUIRY UPDATE – LISTENING TO CANADIAN COVID-19 VACCINE INJURED**

On September 8, 9, 10 and 11, 2026, the Allison Inquiry will be listening to the testimony of Canadians injured by a Covid-19 vaccine. Canadians from across the country will give their testimony live from Parliament Hill in Ottawa.

The inquiry will be chaired by Member of Parliament Dean Allison. The inquiry is non-partisan. Members of Parliament and Senators from all parties have been sent requests to attend. The Inquiry gives all Members of Parliament a formal setting to listen to Canadians who need their voices heard by Parliament.

Members of Parliament who have themselves been injured by the Covid-19 vaccines are also encouraged to apply to be witnesses.

## **The Silence is broken.**

The Allison Inquiry was announced on June 4th, 2026. Since then, the Inquiry has been flooded with applications from Covid-19 vaccine injured Canadians who want to share their stories.

Canadians injured by the Covid-19 vaccines want to share their stories. Canadians injured by the Covid-19 vaccines are revealing that that they have been marginalized within Canada. Canada's reluctance to have a full and open discussion about Covid-19 vaccine injuries, has come at a cost to those who were injured trying to protect the rest of us.

The announcement of the Allison Inquiry has ignited a discussion about Covid-19 vaccine injury within Canada. It has been a welcome first step.

On July 9, at 10 a.m. the Allison Inquiry is having a press conference in Parliament's Press Gallery. Updates on the progress and challenges facing the Inquiry will be shared.

More than 30 democratic countries, including may G7 and Commonwealth nations, have launched major Covid-19 inquiries examining lock downs, mandates, vaccines, and government decision-making.

Canada has yet to undertake any Parliamentary inquiry concerning Covid-19.

The Allison Inquiry is a preliminary inquiry to create a neutral forum for Canadians to share their personal experiences of injuries to themselves, or to others, from the Covid-19 vaccine(s).
