Sample Speaking Outline for Council or Committee Presentation

Topic Example: Opposition to Proposed Bylaw Affecting Local Zoning

1. Opening (30 seconds)

"Good evening, Mayor and Council. My name is [Your Full Name], and I live in [Your Neighborhood or Community]. Thank you for the opportunity to speak today."

2. State Your Position Clearly (30 seconds)

Even if you're opposing something, try to show you're reasonable and solution-oriented.

"If more commercial development is needed, perhaps the city can prioritize areas already zoned for that use, or hold a broader consultation with residents before proceeding."

5. Closing & Call to Action (30 seconds)

"Please delay a decision on this bylaw until proper community consultation can occur. I urge you to listen to residents and prioritize the long-term livability of our neighborhoods."

"Thank you again for your time. I'd be happy to answer any questions."
